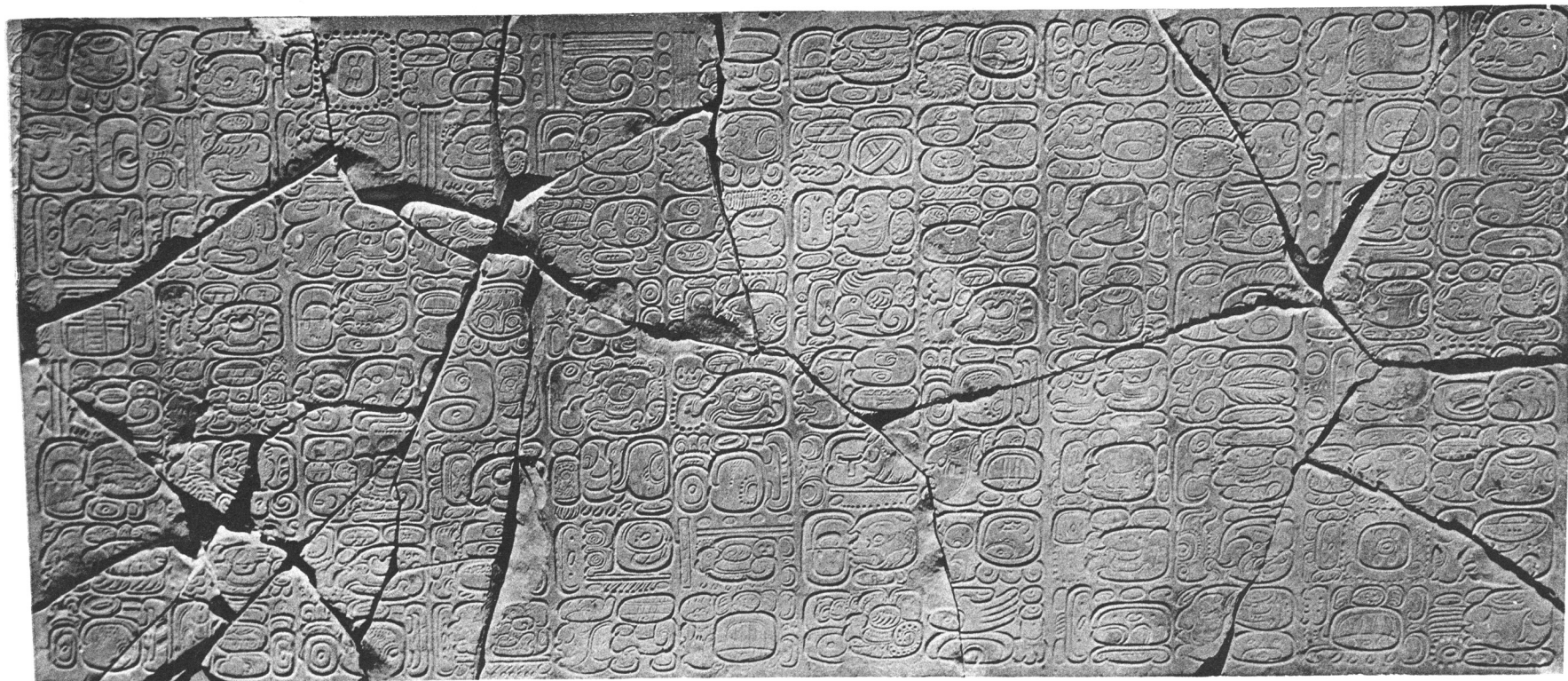
Note Venus and lunar glyph as part of what is possibly the distance number introductory glyph (E7), unusual variants Lamat and Pax (D4b, G8), the cauc glyph with affixes (A8, C8, F6, H5), one shell completion glyph (I8), five katuns (L6), winged cauc with kan cross infix (L4b), "elephant trunk" prefix as in Dresden (E5).

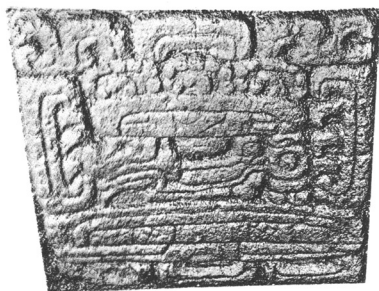

Note the unusual form of Glyph A with coefficient inside the crescent and head forms for Ceh and haab.

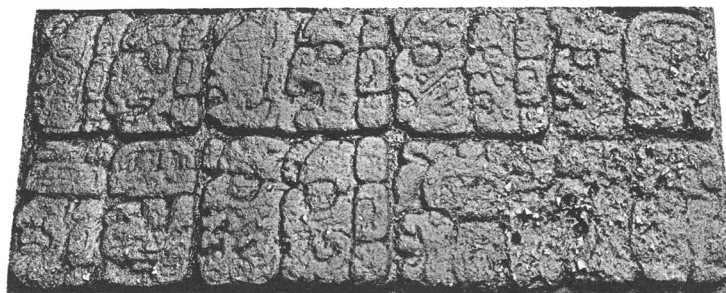
